



PROGRAM OVERVIEW: INTRODUCTION

 The Community Engagement Support Program (CESP) provides targeted financial support for mineral exploration companies, junior mining companies, and potentially impacted communities for engagement activities early in a mining project's life cycle

PROGRAM OVERVIEW: PURPOSE

- The Community Engagement Support Program (CESP) provides financial incentives for mineral exploration and development in the territory
- Engagement activity above and beyond regulatory requirements, and at a stage in the development process before the major requirements have kicked in
 - Targeted towards exploration activities

PURPOSE

- Early, effective community engagement activities can:
 - Create an avenue for communities to derive significant direct benefits from mineral development
 - Strengthen relationships between proponents and potentially impacted communities
 - Improve social licensing, leading to increased valuations for junior mining companies
 - Improve investor confidence in Nunavut as a jurisdiction in which to do business



ELIGIBILITY

- Two funding streams are available under the CESP:
 - 1. Funding for proponents to cover eligible expenses related to engagement initiatives
 - 2. Funding for community organizations to retain technical expertise to understand and evaluate information provided during the engagement process

ELIGIBLE EXPENSES

1. Proponents:

- Costs associated with direct community engagement
 - Salary of project liaison employee
 - Travel costs
 - Document preparation (must be translated)
 - Facilitation services
 - Translation and interpretation services
 - Facility rental
 - Advertising
 - Catering
- Costs associated with development of engagement materials
 - Consulting services associated with developing engagement plans and summary reports

ELIGIBLE EXPENSES

2. Communities:

 Costs associated with procuring technical advice and expertise to understand and evaluate information presented during the engagement process

*** Communities can apply for funding independent of whether a proponent is utilizing the program for the nearby project ***

EVALUATION

1. Proponents

- Community involvement
- Technical and financial feasibility
- Local economic benefit
- Past performance
- Environmental stewardship

2. Communities

- Project in local area
- Work being completed in fiscal year
- Materials requiring review by communities/community groups

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- At the end of the fiscal year, proponents will be required to provide:
 - Final community engagement plan
 - Engagement summary and final report
 - Schedule of revenue and expenses, including
 - Allocation of funding
 - Percentage of funds expended in Nunavut
 - Amount of total funding used for liaison staff salaries
- Communities will be required to submit invoices for expertise and a summary of any review work completed

APPLICATION AND FUNDING PERIOD

- Applications will be accepted until March 31
 - Applications received after this date will be subject to remaining available funding
- Funding period is April 1 to March 31 of a given fiscal year
 - Contributions are awarded on an annual basis
 - Successful applicants are eligible to submit proposals for consecutive or subsequent project years and phases

FUNDING

- Maximum allowable funding is \$100,000 per proposal
 - 60% of funding to be provided in advance of proposed activities
 - 40% of funding to be provided upon receipt and review of final report by the department

ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES

- The expected specific and measurable results of the Program include:
 - Increased investment in Nunavut's mineral exploration industry
 - Increased mineral exploration project approvals
 - Increased direct benefits to communities from mineral exploration (jobs, contracting)





NEXT STEPS

- Application forms and materials are currently be finalized by the department
- Applications will be open for the 2019-2020 fiscal year
 - Interested applicants are encouraged to get in contact with program staff at any time
- Policy is available online from the Department of Economic Development and Transportation webpage
 - Application form and guidelines to be posted later this month
