Example of the wish list

Proposal: To have an effective summer sport activities for the community, we need to change our location of the multi-purpose facility. A site has been selected to construct this new facility. We envision a 400' x 400' pad with a gravel base and a sand playing field. A six foot high chain link fencing would be installed around the perimeter of the pad with a regulation backstop.

AEM agreed to be the only sponsor to this project and is proud to be part of the community development. The facility is for a baseball and a soccer field.

How AEM do a difference in the Community



AEM devote time resources to nurturing dialogue and building relationship with local citizens and host communities. Shortly after our arrival at Meadowbank, we held a barbecue and event that attracted more than 500 local people. We also publish newsletters and formed a Meadowbank Community Liaison Committee for ongoing community engagement in an area seeing industrial development for the first time.

AEM has signed an Inuit Impact Benefits Agreement that provides funding for education and skills development, a means to maximize Inuit employment and business opportunities, and the opportunity to develop skills that enable our Inuit employees to advance.
