

# LANGWAY PUTULIK

## MILLWRIGHT

Originally from Chesterfield Inlet, Langway Putulik joined Agnico Eagle as a Process Plant Helper at Meadowbank mine in 2010. Less than a year later, Langway began his apprenticeship journey to become a Millwright.

Over a four year period he worked at Meadowbank Mine while also attending the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology to complete his technical training and academic studies.

He completed the required studies and achieved the practical work hours at Meadowbank to become certified as a Millwright Class 2

tradesman and in 2015 he passed his Red Seal exam. Langway's determination and commitment, combined with the support from Agnico Eagle's Apprenticeship Program, has resulted in him becoming the first of many Inuit to graduate with a skilled trade from our Nunavut operations.
