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Recommendations from the Options and Recommendations document form the Draft Nunavut Land Use Plan

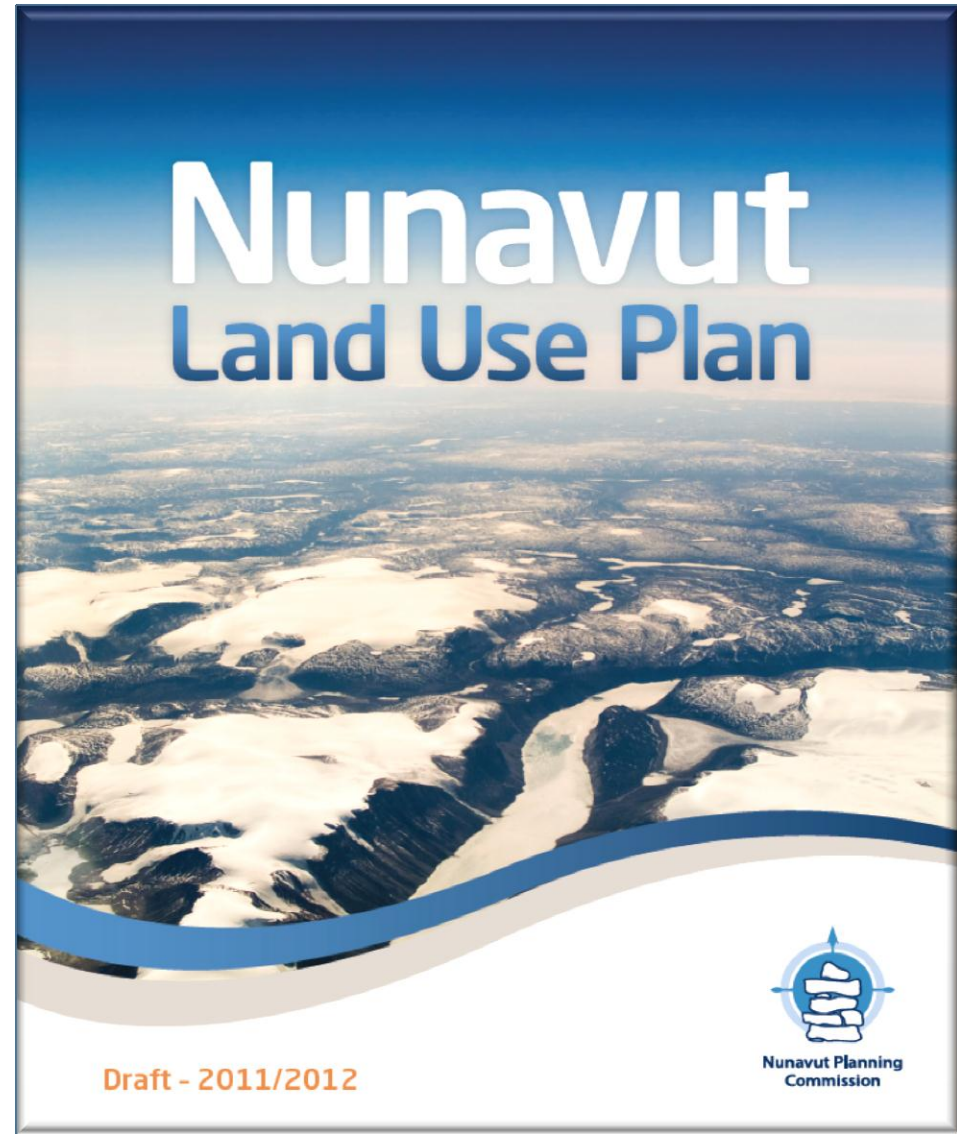


Draft Nunavut Land Use Plan

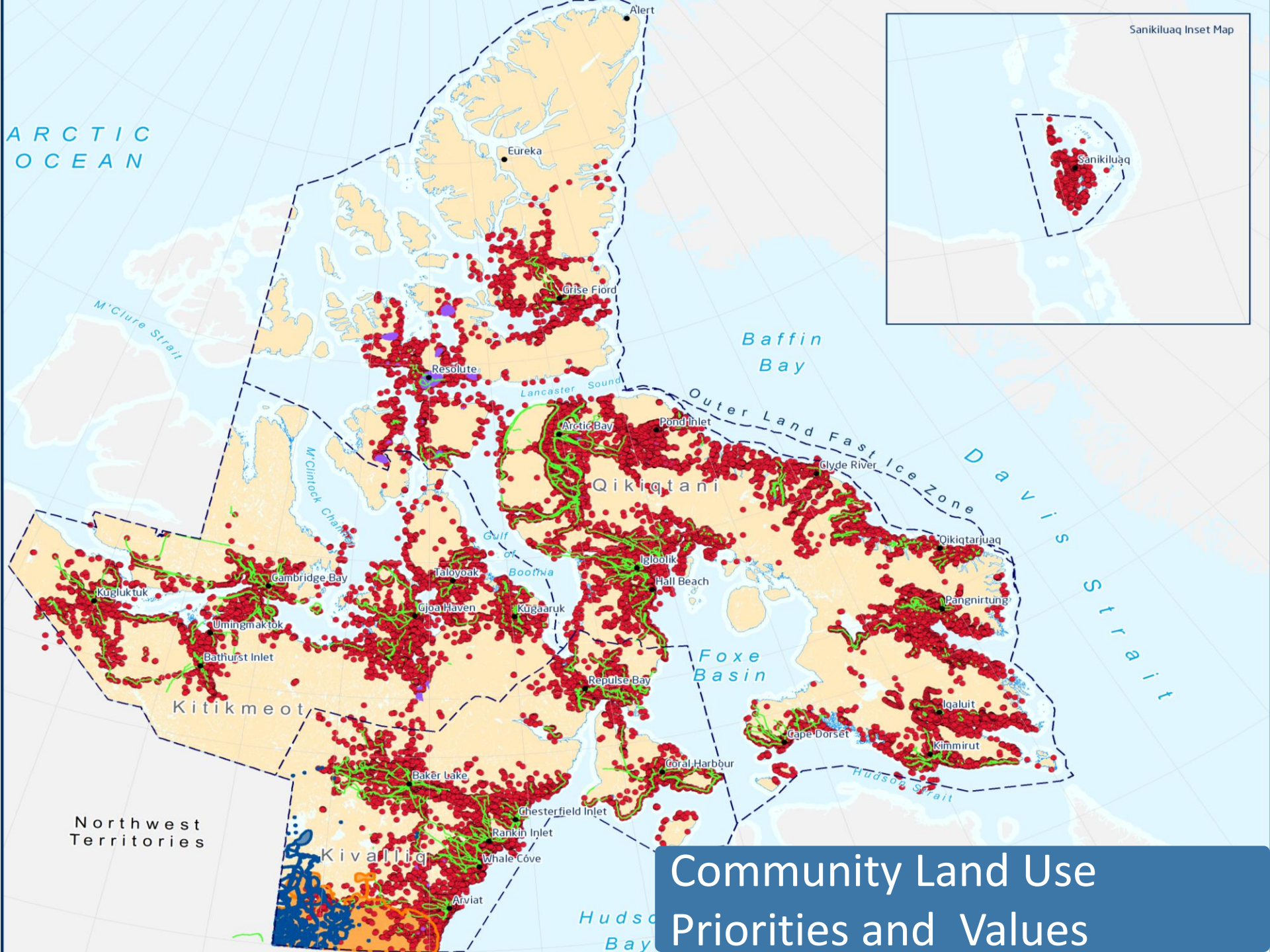
