Canada Transportation Act Review (Background)

- The last review of the Canada Transportation Act was completed in 2001
- The review of the CTA was launched by the Minister of Transport June 25th,
 2014.
- The CTA Review Panel was chaired by the Honourable David Emerson.
- Focus of review was to align transportation infrastructure development with economic development activities, ensuring capacity exists to transport freight across the country as needed.
- The terms of reference for the review also include how to address rapid changes in the North, the sustainability of the northern transportation system, and specifically, the federal role in supporting the northern transportation system.





The Government of Nunavut's Proposal under the Building Canada Fund: National Infrastructure Component






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Location Map of Projects

Activity to Date


- Business Case for \$50 million submitted to federal government
- Business Case asks for \$37.5 million in federal funding to cover costs to complete environmental assessment and construction of winter road to Rankin Inlet
- No formal reply yet from Canada
- This project is a standing agenda item for the Hudson Bay Regional Roundtable (HBRRT)

Next Steps

- Per February 2016 HBRRT Resolution Winter Road Working group to convene within 90 days to discuss/confirm next steps
- All work should consider synergies with Energy Options Group
- Expect clearer path forward after April 19, 2016 provincial election in Manitoba





Activity to Date


- Approval in Principle (AIP) by the federal government
- AIP confirms \$63.7 million in federal funding
- Legislative Assembly has approved \$5 million in GN funding for 2016/17 FY

Next Steps

- Execution of federal funding agreement (Maximum \$63.7 million)
- Additional consultations, environmental/design work to be done in 2016/17
- Project to be delegated to CGS (Competitive process for design, construction or design/build expected)
- Obtain necessary permits/licences and authorizations for field work
- Submission of project proposal to NIRB
- Construction start in summer of 2017

Activity to Date


- Business Case submitted to federal government (Has been updated 5 times)
- Business Case is for total of \$487.5 million or \$365.6 million in federal funding
- No formal reply yet from Canada
- GN/NRC portion to be financed and paid through road tolls
- Project was referenced/highlighted in recently released Canada Transportation Act review report

Next Steps

- Formal creation of a Grays Bay Road & Port Project Working Group
- Execution of MOU with MMG to obtain use of their engineering and environmental data for environmental assessment
- Discussion with NIRB on how to proceed with EA

Tabling of the Canada Transportation Act Review Report

I am writing to commend you for tabling the Canada Transportation Act Review Report in Parliament on Fabruary 25, 2016.
